Millennium Development Goals

In 2000, Millennium Development Goals were established

- The key goal to be achieved by 2015 - eradication of extreme poverty
- Significant progress in achieving



Post-2015 Framework

- Future collapse of global industrial civilization (recent NASA study) due to:
 - unsustainable resource exploitation
 - unequal wealth distribution
- Meeting basic human needs & promoting inclusive and sustainable development
- Promoting technology innovation - increasingly high priority for emerging economies



Global Challenges for Innovation and Development

Global economy is striving to gain new momentum despite many obstacles...

- Asymmetries in the technological development
- Infrastructure is underdeveloped
- Lack of cooperation on a global scale



Re-Thinking Institutional Design: Growing Global Pie

- More inclusive knowledge & technology distribution
- More people innovate = more people to benefit in the economy
- Global IP regime should be re-shaped to facilitate innovation and development



Re-Thinking Institutional Design: Cooperation on Infrastructure

- Infrastructure development lags behind the pace of economic change
- Cooperation is essential for infrastructure development
- Clear & fair rules for cross-border cooperation to be established
