Terms of Reference Draft
15 August 2022

Background and objective

Aligned with the goal of B20 Indonesia presidency, the Future of Work and Education Task Force have organized a dialogue forum with the G20 ministers and global stakeholders, with the aim of raising awareness on how Future of Work and Education can propel global recovery, growth, and transformation. We design this event to report and promote strategic discussion around the actionable policy recommendations developed during the B20 cycle by the Future of Work and Education Task Force.

We have formulated four recommendations to support our key theme and guide our discussion during the B20 – G20 Dialogue, which are to:

1. Supporting post-pandemic recovery and growth, aligned to the Future of Work – accelerating job creation and work transition in alignment with the sectors of the future, supported by dynamic and flexible labor markets.
2. Upgrading education and lifelong learning systems to align with the Future of Work – improving learning and work-transition systems to meet labor-market needs, thereby boosting productivity and innovation and narrowing skills gaps.
3. Ensuring that workforce inclusion accelerates after the pandemic setback – ensuring that every part of society is included in recovery and growth efforts, with special attention paid to the vulnerable and to labor-market formalization.

The B20 – G20 Dialogue will be attended by global business leaders along with representatives from Indonesia Government and Institutions, and from other G20 countries. The core of the event will be on the panel session where the Future of Work and Education Task Force Chair, Deputy Chair, Co-Chairs, Indonesia Government and Global Institutions, and the Future of Work and Education Task Force Network Partners will address the key highlights of each recommendation.
